233-3

No person shall place or string any sign, banner, streamer or other device for advertising purposes over and across the whole or any portion of any public street within the corporate limits of the City, except upon occasions of public celebrations and exhibitions and upon the written permission of the Police Director. Nothing herein contained shall prevent the erection of advertising signs in conformity with the provisions of existing ordinances not in conflict with the provisions of this chapter.

233-4

No person shall post or cause to be posted any bill, placard, notice or advertisement of any kind whatsoever upon any building, wall, fence or post without the consent of the owner thereof, within or adjoining any street or thoroughfare of the City.

315-48

No sign shall be erected in the City that would:

A. Obstruct the sight distance at an intersection along a public right-of-way.

D. No sign, other than official traffic control devices or street signs, shall be erected within, or encroach upon, the right-of-way lines of any street, unless specifically authorized by other ordinances or regulations of the City.

315-155

Except for temporary real estate signs, a temporary sign shall not remain in place for a period exceeding six months.

315-157

The following signs may be erected, constructed, placed and maintained without a permit, but may be regulated during site plan review:

A. Temporary real estate signs. Such signs shall not be illuminated nor exceed four square feet.
